Anne Browning McIntosh, City Planning and Administration Consultant, has 23 years of experience working in municipal government. Since 2001, Anne Browning McIntosh has been a private consultant specializing in city planning and administration. An adjunct professor in the sociology department at Whittier College, she has been a historic preservation commissioner for the City of Monrovia since 1995. Prior to becoming a consultant, she was the Assistant City Manager for the City of South Pasadena where she directed the city's human resources functions; served as the Director of Development Services for the City of Sierra Madre; Planning Manager for the City of West Hollywood; and Community Development Specialist for the City of Manhattan Beach. She has been active in the American Planning Association, California Chapter.
